Who are the Congregationalists?

Congregationalists are one of the four historic streams of the United Church of Christ (UCC). At MCC, we trace our heritage to the Pilgrims of colonial America and the founding of Monroe.

Who is the United Church of Christ?

The Monroe Congregational Church covenants with other local churches in the UCC to share the mission work that no congregation is able to do on its own. UCC polity is like an inverted pyramid, each congregation makes their own decisions about hiring clergy, calling leadership, setting a vision and selecting mission priorities.

During our hour or so together, we seek forgiveness for our shortcomings and direction for our lives. Our hymnal uses inclusive/expansive language, and our music al offerings are diverse. Dressing up is not required, come in whatever you are most comfortable.

On most Sundays, we offer Sunday School for children aged 3-13. The nursery is always open for little ones, or you may keep them with you. We are child-friendly!
