### THE CUSTOMER EXPERIENCE

In January and February, many of the decisions about how to make the festival happen had to be figured out, even though we didn't know what the pandemic landscape would look like in June. We thought it best to be conservative—to expect that strict regulations would still be in place. So, we went ahead and started planning a festival that would follow the then-current state and town regulations.

We found that tents were hard to come by because so many restaurants were having customers dine outdoors—which is when we realized that we would need to provide outdoor dining for the festival. We also made the decision to eliminate home-baked goods like breads and cookies, as well as smoothies, which we thought could be difficult for health-inspection requirements. We eliminated face painting and children's games. Even today with so many people vaccinated, this seems like a smart decision because of the size of crowds that gather in game alley with young children and their families.

This year's festival will be a mix of the familiar and the new. Many of our customers who have been coming to the festival for years may be a little confused by the changes. For that reason, MCC hospitality will be more important this year than it's ever been.

Customers will go to the order tents (one each for cash and credit) near the top of the driveway on Church Street. At the order tents, customers will be able to order everything (sample order form below). Once a customer pays, a Berry Runner (Sr. PF) will take the order form to the Expeditors in Wilton Hall, who will package up the order. The Berry Runner will then take the fulfilled order down the sidewalk and deliver it to the customer. Customers can dine in the parking lot where there will be tents and tables in the shade or they can sit at one of the many picnic tables and high-top tables spread out around the campus.

Many of us did not want another year to go by without a Strawberry Festival. We decided to keep the festival simple, which I think we can accomplish with your help. Let's stay positive, find the good in all that we do, and make sure our customers and community know we pulled this off the best way we could—and let's leave them happy and enthusiastic enough to come back for the 50th!
