This month begins the season of Lent. Often we hear of people giving things up for Lent. We might decide not to eat desserts, candy, and chocolate, drink alcohol or coffee or snack between meals. Some people quit smoking. But there is something else we can do for Lent... we can give God more of our time.

There are 168 hours in each week. How many of those hours do we give to walking faithfully with God? It's true that most of us are very busy, and we don't often have enough time to do all the things we want to do. This, by the way, is one reason I haven't been able to expand my hobby farm yet to include goats or alpacas... not enough time!

Research reveals that the "typical" global internet user now spends almost 7 hours per day – 6 hours and 58 minutes to be precise – using the internet across all devices<sup>1</sup>. While it's true that for many of us those hours include work endeavors, we also know our phones and tablets can be a huge time suck!

How we use our time reflects our priorities in life. If God is important to us, God deserves quality time; not just what is left over. In 1 Thessalonians 5:16, we read: "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." If we decide to spend more of our time in prayer with God, we will have a transformational Lent. How do we do that?

Attending worship regularly is an excellent Lenten practice. We might decide to read a chapter of scripture each day, or to pray longer or more often, or to spend time meditating. Pray for others. Pray for the world. Pray for the sick. Pray for the lonely. Pray for yourself. Prayer isn't just good for others; it is good for us too! It is a wonderful connection to God. It also gives us an opportunity to do something during times of crisis, fear, frustration, or even joy.



# Elisha's Corner

### **Church Parlor to Beardsley Hall**



How is it that Beardsley Hall was named for Elizabeth A. Beardsley's late husband, Dr. Edward McEwen Beardsley, when it was built in 1886, when he did not die until March 11, 1905? It turns out that it wasn't. A review of the "New Stratford Ecclesiastical Society Book of Records 1841 -1936" and the "Ladies Improvement Society Minutes of June 1931 - May 1936" gives evidence that the structure built in 1886 was simply called the "Church Parlor". Two letters found in our archives (Ladies Improvement Society Correspondence -1982), one from Bessie Misc. Denison and the other from Mildred Fagan both entitled, "In the Beginning", provide a summarized history of how it all came about.

A few years prior to 1886, Elizabeth Beardslev decided that the new Meeting House of forty-nine vears "hall" for needed а social gathering. According to Mildred, she started a fund for it with five dollars "and decided to make it grow into a hall". She inspired the few of the fiftynine women of the church at the time to join in fund raising making, activities: auilt strawberry shortcake dinners (had to have one of those), ice cream socials, fairs, and such.



The Ladies Improvement Society

Two of the women were her daughters, Sarah (Beardsley) Sinclair, and Elizabeth Adeline (Beardsley) Sears. By 1886 they had raised enough money to convince Sarah's brotherin-law, Robert Sinclair, to donate the property between the Meeting House and the Town Hall/Masonic Lodge Hall for their building. This was a project independent of the Church itself. In those days, say both Mildred and Bessie, "it was considered improper for a woman to handle money", so they secured the services of the then Church Treasurer, Albert Wheeler, to handle their finances. When the building was finished it was referred to as "the Church Parlor". According to Mildred's summary letter, Elizabeth Beardsley wanted the building named in honor of her husband, Dr. Edward M. Beardsley. It is safe to presume that he had a significant financial hand in his wife's project. But, alas, it remained "the Church Parlor".

The offshoot of this project was the creation and incorporation, "by resolution of the State House of Representatives of the Ladies Improvement Society of the Monroe Congregational Church, January Secession, A.D. 1887", the following year. There were fourteen charter members. It was this ladies society that maintained the Parlor through more fundraisers. They purchased two wood stoves for heating and replaced three different kitchen stoves over the next three years. They provided kitchenware and serving pieces, silverware, chairs (which they rented), linoleum flooring, and painting. There was no central plumbing or running water though. The Parlor was rented to the Grange for their meetings before their own facility was built. Anything that was "proper" to raise money for the Parlor's upkeep was tried and carried forward. It remained the "Church Parlor" until 1933; twenty-eight years after the death of Dr. Beardsley and thirteen years after the death of Elizabeth.

The Society minutes of February 16, 1933, records "A motion made and seconded to change the name of Church Parlor to Beardsley Hall. Carried. A motion made to name a committee to purchase a tablet and have it properly inscribed to be placed on the outside of the Hall. Carried. The committee as follow: Mrs. Sears, Mrs. Sinclair (Dr. Beardsley's two daughters, and) Mrs. Stanley." Both Bessie Denison and Mildred Fagan were in attendance. It would have been more beneficial for historical purposes if the minutes reflected who made the motion and the second, and precisely for whom the Hall was named. Bessie Denison's letter declares that, "... the Hall was named in honor of its founder". It may be that because the recording Secretary was Dr. Beardsley's granddaughter-in-law, Alice (Shelton) Beardsley, more detail was not forthcoming. Yet, with the Beardsley daughters present, and their knowing Elizabeth's desire, the likelihood is that it was, in fact, "named in honor of her late husband", however unceremoniously.

Two years after this took place, the July 11, 1935 Society minutes recorded "It was voted to let the men connect the building on to Beardsley Hall & Ladies to help all they can." The September 19<sup>th</sup> minutes indicate a corner stone was to be laid to attach the Old Tannery Road school house to the back of the Hall. The Men's Club had purchased the school house at auction held by the Town of 7<sup>th</sup> The November Monroe. meeting minutes indicate that the Ladies "pay \$200 to the Men's Club." So, not surprisingly, they were involved in the finance of the addition. Finally, on January



16, 1936 it was noted that a letter was "received from the Men's Club thanking the Ladies for (their) help in getting the Hall fixed." The kitchen was relocated in the school house addition, and plumbing and electricity were added to the building.

At the Annual Church Meeting of January 1953, the Society Secretary, Bessie Denison, reported that they had a membership of 23 ladies and concluded that, "As the membership in our society is small and does not seem to grow very fast, we feel that the church should take the burden of Beardsley Hall from us, but we would continue to contribute towards its support as much as we are able." So after an amazing sixty-seven years, driven by the conviction and purpose that still exists today, it was done. In July of 1956, the congregation took on the expansion of Beardsley Hall with the addition out the east side of the building to add needed class rooms for Sunday school. After some schedule impacting delays, it was completed in January 1958, when the keys to the new front door were presented by the builder, T. R. Burghart, Inc., of Bridgeport.


