Who is Senior PF?

Senior Pilgrim Fellowship (Sr PF) is a student-led, open and affirming, faith-based high school youth group which gives young people an opportunity to enjoy one another's company and build community in an accepting atmosphere.

We meet on Sundays from 5:00-7:30 pm. Mutual support, discussion of adolescent issues, spiritual growth, service to others, music, prayer and fun are



emphasized. Sr PF is a safe place for youth to connect to each other without being judged, and is open to members of other faith communities as well as those with no formal faith background.

Our Student Leadership team are elected by their peers every year. The President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Minister of Outreach are responsible for managing the program, with guidance and support from a six person Adult Leadership team that has over 50 years of experience working with youth and young adults. They are: Kelsey Kaminski (Lead Advisor), Joe Gilberti, Kiersten Rooney, Josh Post, Paul Cardentey and Jennifer Gingras (Senior Pastor).

Community Service is an important part of what we do. We have cleaned up Lake Zoar and hiking trails on Earth Day, visited shut-ins to bring them a hot meal, raked leaves for seniors and collected coats for people living in homeless shelters. Our goal is to have one opportunity a month to give back by serving together.

We go on a Fall Retreat together at Silver Lake Conference Center, to help the group bond and get to know each other better. Fundraisers are held throughout the year to raise money for our programs. In the spring, PF leads the church in Youth Sunday - a worship service they create from scratch.

In July we travel together on a mission trip, volunteering our time and talents with local non-profits working to improve their community. We work in food pantries, vacation Bible schools and homeless shelters. We have done light construction and disaster relief. In Senior PF, we believe that volunteering our time, talents and love to those who are in need gives us opportunities to grow and learn.

Unfortunately, due to health code limitations and travel restrictions, we were unable to have a mission trip in 2020. We have served in Detroit MI, Pipestem WV, Boston MA, Harlan KY, New Orleans LA, Cleveland OH, Burlington NC, Milwaukee WI, Buffalo NY, Chicago IL, Vicksburg MS and Indianapolis IN. This year, we plan to go to Hancock, Maine.

Monroe Congregational Church 2021 Capital Campaign – Painting Rexford House



Dear MCC members and friends,

Our historic MCC campus includes four buildings that require ongoing upkeep and painting every 5-10 years. If you have been to the campus lately, you may have noticed that Rexford House is in dire need of a paint job, with the paint peeling and chipping in several areas. The estimated cost to paint Rexford House is \$9,000, and we are hoping to have the painting completed in the Fall. Since we have been drawing on the church's endowment to support our operating budget each year,

the board of trustees would like to enlist the congregation's support for the Rexford painting project.

So we are launching a capital campaign this year, with the goal of raising the \$9,000 needed to complete the painting.
