The Price of Love

"Grief, sorrow, and sadness are the price of love," said a trusted friend of mine last week. She was responding to my telling her about illness in my family with my brother's upcoming immunotherapy treatment for Prostate Cancer, and my eighty-nine-year-old aunt being hospitalized up in New London, Connecticut recently. During our conversation, I had to admit that I am out of my depth when illness comes upon our family. Even though I am a certified grief therapist, as well as licensed counselor, when circumstances become personal rather than professional, I feel vulnerable. Being vulnerable opens the door to the depth of emotion that connects us with those we love. To have been able to love deeply and passionately is a gift we are given by God's grace. I was reminded this idea in the film Marvin's Room.

In the last scenes of the movie, Marvin's Room, (1997), Bessie played by Diane Keaton, recently diagnosed with Leukemia, has a conversation with her sister Lee, played by Meryl Streep. The two sisters have been estranged for seventeen years until the onset of Bessie's Leukemia, which has necessitated finding a family member who could possibly become a bone marrow donor. Lee travels with her sons, Hank and Charlie to Florida from Ohio, and they reunite with Bessie who has been caring for the sisters' father, Marvin and Aunt Ruth. Dr. Wally eventually tells Bessie that a suitable donor in the family could not be found. She knows the prognosis is not good for her life expectancy. Now realistically faced with her own death, Bessie reflects on how her life spent caring for her father, Marvin and Aunt Ruth has blessed her. To an outsider, caring for an elderly man whose physical condition has slowly deteriorated over twenty years, and an elderly Aunt fascinated with afternoon soap operas, might seem unrewarding at

best. But for Bessie, to have had the capacity to love deeply, gave her a purpose for living. At the end of the film she explains to her sister, Lee, how grateful she feels for her life.

"Oh, Lee, I've been so lucky to have had Dad and Ruth. I've had such love in my life. I look back and I've been so lucky to have been able to love them."

Having a purpose in life may be fulfilled by making a commitment to care for others, and love others deeply as Bessie was able to do with Marvin and Aunt Ruth. In a paraphrase of words by Reinhold Niebuhr (1892-1971), "The Serenity Prayer" could be used to describe Bessie's 'serenity to accept the things she cannot change in her health condition, along with the courage to change what she can' before she dies. Her attitude has a life changing influence on her sister, Lee, who rethinks her plan to return to Ohio, and decides to stay and help with the care of Marvin and Aunt Ruth in Florida. The film ends with Lee stepping into Bessie's role and as she prepares the combination for her father's mid-day medication.

Marvin's Room has provided a contemporary illustration for me during this Lenten season of the kind of deep love that Jesus carried into the world and for which we hunger. There is a price for this love even though we may not realize what is being asked of us at first. Yes, I feel the cost of love for my family members! I felt relief and gratitude when I heard that my brother could eat the granola I sent him a week after the intensive radiation left him barely able to swallow. And on my second hospital visit to my aunt, I was heartened to see her sitting up, eyes open when she recognized me! But today her prognosis was not good. We yearn to achieve serenity in an acceptance of "both and thinking." Richard Rohr explains it this way. "This calm allows you to confront what must be confronted with even greater clarity and incisiveness" (Rohr, 146).

May grace strengthen all of our commitments to continue on our pilgrimage together as we draw nearer to Jerusalem.

Mission is the Flower of Discipleship



Greetings MCC! It has dawned on me that month after month I have been putting a lot of information out and asking y'all to journey with me and you don't really know anything about me. I firmly believe that our sojourn together rests firmly on relationships so I want to tell you a bit about myself.

Besides being your Director of Faith Formation I am also a Member in Discernment at MCC and have an appointment with the Fairfield East Association in April. I am in discernment to become a Commissioned or Ordained Minister – hence discernment. I have a clear call from God to be

doing what I do and the understanding of my call is directly related to discipleship and mission. I believe that discipleship isn't about being perfect, it's about following. By definition, a disciple is "a follower, one who accepts and assists in spreading the principles of another". A Christian disciple is a person who accepts and assists in the spreading of the good news of Jesus Christ. In Christian discipleship, we grow in Jesus Christ and are equipped by the Holy Spirit to overcome the pressures and hardships of life and become more and more like Christ. We all follow God through the example of Jesus Christ and we also in turn support and follow each other.

I believe that that mission is the flower of discipleship. By definition, a flower is "the seedbearing part of a plant", so if Christ is the root of the disciple and the disciple is the plant, mission is the flower. Through mission work I am able to spread the example of Jesus Christ through my actions and the work of my hands and heart. For me mission is not just about serving in Boston, South Korea, West Virginia, or on the Cheyenne River Reservation in La Plant, South Dakota, it is also about serving the people at church through actively sharing my knowledge, experiences, and witness as well as modeling the Christian life to the best of my ability. It's about inviting others to participate on the journey together.

I have lead numerous trips out to the Cheyenne River Reservation over the years and am scheduled to lead one with you from June 24th – July 1st. The way I lead these trips starts months before the trip happens by fundraising to pay for the trip so it is not a burden on folks who would like to attend. I also understand that asking folks to pay the Simply Smiles Fee and flight is a lot to ask – hence the fundraising and I have never had a participant pay more than \$200 toward their trip! I have some good fundraising ideas, but so far am the only person from MCC signed up. I am hoping more of you might be interested in going now that you know that cost shouldn't be a factor.
