#### **Growing Our Faith**

"Getting to know you, getting to know all about you," are the familiar words sung by Anna in *The King and I.* I am indeed getting to know you as a unique and stimulating worship community. After my first visit with you last Sunday, January 29, I am confident that we will work well together during Pastor Jenn's ministry in the Holy Land. In that spirit, Pastor Jenn suggested I share some of my own story with you in this issue of *The Steeple*.

My faith journey began at the Indian Hill Episcopal-Presbyterian Church, Cincinnati, Ohio. Caring faith communities across the globe have shaped my faith over the years. I was living in London, England when I recommitted my life to Christ in March 1979. Ten years later, 1989, I began my studies at Yale Divinity School after a life-changing trip to Nicaragua during the Contra War, 1988. Mission trips to Central America almost every year since then have deepened my sense of call for returning three times to Gulfport/Biloxi Mississippi after the devastation of Hurricane Katrina.

One image was particularly strong during my recent trip to Nicaragua January 15-22. I began to wonder how growing our faith today was like being a farmer working with the Finca Modelo or Model Farm?<sup>1</sup> This is a question that formed in my mind as I listened to The Rev.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The farm offers farmers an opportunity to come to the Model Farm, and actually plant their own crops in order to learn to generate practices and techniques for permaculture planting. Or to explain it another way, they would develop ways to cultivate crops under challenging weather conditions including the increasingly dry climate. A learning Center would be created to <u>educate</u> participants at the Farmer Field School. Farmers would also explore ways to "build water harvesting systems" as they <u>simulate</u> and <u>innovate</u> with traditional and nontraditional crops. These crops would not only meet their food needs, but at the same time, replenish and nourish the soil. When farmers would return to their own farms with what they had learned, they would be able practice "small scale replications," to use an image by environmental designer, David Holmgren, an expert on the idea of permaculture.

Leslie Penrose, Executive Director of JustHope, when she took a small group of us to the middle of an eight-acre farm project that began six months ago in Chacraseca, Nicaragua. The Finca Modelo or Model Farm is part of JustHope's vision for "Creating global partnerships that combat extreme poverty and nurture sustainable community."

As six of us and Leslie looked out over a portion of the farm already being prepared to grow papaya, chilies, and chiltomas, we could not help but notice the panoramic view in the distance of the majestic volcanic mountains: Telicia, San Cristobal, Casita, and Santa Rosa. Leslie continued to explain how the Model Farm will focus on "four critical areas: Generate, Innovate, Simulate, and Educate," or "GISE" which is "an older English word that means 'to feed or pasture."

So, how might we use the image of a Model Farm to grow our faith today? How do we 'feed or pasture' our faith practice? We 'feed or pasture' our faith as we build trust in a worshiping community, almost like a farmer coming to a Model Farm to cultivate a season of crops. Our participation in this worshiping community helps us to <u>generate</u> creative ways to live in an increasingly dry, spiritual climate. We <u>educate</u> and are educated with the proclamation of the Word of God and celebration of the Sacraments, the Lord's Supper and Baptism. When we work together to practice our traditions we invite others to come to church to see what we are doing. And when we carry a new harvest of hope and care for our own intergenerational community out into the larger world, we <u>simulate</u> what we have learned about how to be flexible and we are more <u>innovative</u> with others different from ourselves.

Thus, we are prepared to witness daily to our faith in every imaginable setting. And through it all, we continually thank God that the Holy Spirit challenges us to travel near and far to different pastures in mission, where we become learners all over again, and come back with a new story to tell.

# Call to Annual Congregational Meeting, Continued February 19, 2017

The members of Monroe Congregational Church are hereby called to attend the conclusion of the Annual Meeting of the Congregation to be held in the meeting house immediately following worship on Feb 19. The agenda will include a motion to amend our constitution and the election of an additional board member. See text of the amendment below:

# Amendment I: Extending Term of Board and Committee Members by One Additional Year

In the event and upon specific occasion or circumstances it is deemed necessary for the good of the congregation and its work, the Church Council may take exception to the provision of Article X, Section 1, and extend the term of office of any Board or Committee member or members for an additional one time, one (1) year. Following an affirmative two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Council quorum, the Church Moderator shall instruct the nominating committee to include the affected board or committee member or members on the list of recommended candidates for

election at the annual meeting, or subsequently scheduled special general meeting of the congregation. An affirmative two-thirds (2/3) vote by the quorum of the congregation at its annual meeting or special general meeting shall be required to elect the affected board or committee member or members. Such action shall not establish a precedent and shall be justified on its own individual merits.

# A word of explanation:

Our Annual Congregational Meeting of January 29 ended in recess, rather than adjournment. We did that because we propose to re-elect Mark Barnhart to an additional term as Trustee, which he has graciously agreed to serve – but he has already reached the term limit for that office. To make an exception we need this amendment to our Constitution, and an amendment requires two weeks' notice prior to the meeting. In order to provide the two weeks' notice, we recessed our meeting to reconvene on February 19 immediately after worship. Since we already agreed to do this, it will only take a few minutes to reconvene, pass the amendment, and confirm Mark's election. We thank you for your patience, understanding, and especially for your participation as we complete this work and adjourn our annual meeting.
