Prepare to enter the experience: Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14 and extends until East Sunday on April 1. I think it's kind of cool this year that this meaningful season begins with a day that is set aside to remember love, and ends on a day when we are free to laugh heartily with resurrection joy. After all, the Apostle Paul wrote in his 1st letter to the Corinthians "For the word of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." (chapter 1, verse 18)

For Christ-followers, Lent is a time to focus on the life of Jesus and our lives as disciples, exploring the ways we give and receive hospitality. When Jesus washed the disciple's feet, he showed them that they need to be able to receive as well as give hospitality. Lent is also a season of telling stories of faith. From the days of the earliest church, this time focused on mentoring those who were new to following "the way" in order to prepare them for baptism at the Easter vigil.

How do we relate to these two themes: hospitality and testimony? Quite simply. At the same time as we live out our lives as disciples, giving and receiving hospitality, we also review our theology, beliefs and the covenants we have made with God. We not only affirm them, but we focus on our roles as teachers and mentors for those who are eager to learn the faith. A tall order? Perhaps. Some of our best teaching is done by example. What better way to spend Lent than by extending real hospitality and telling stories?



We hope that you will join us at the <u>Ash Wednesday Soup</u> <u>Supper on February 14th at 6:30pm</u> in Wilton Hall. The meal this year is "pot-luck" style, so if you are able to come we hope that you can bring a pot of soup or some bread to share. Please sign up in Wilton Hall. We'll share a prayer and engage in some guided conversation before we head into the meetinghouse for an Ash Wednesday service at 7:30, with the

imposition of ashes and ending with an opportunity to burn a confession in a bonfire.

In this Steeple, you will see that we are offering many opportunities for everyone – of all ages – to take part in a meaningful Lenten journey. I hope that you will consider taking part in some (or all!) of them. May this be a time of deepening faith and hospitality for us all!

Courageous Faith and the Journey to Easter



I was recently reading a Midrash about the story of the Parting of the Red Sea. For those of you unfamiliar with the term, a Midrash is an ancient commentary on the Hebrew Scriptures or what we call the Old Testament. This particular commentary mentioned that the way the Parting happened was not how we envision it or how it is

portrayed in Hollywood – you know Moses looks up to the sky, drives his staff into the sea, and then miraculously the waters separate – but rather the waters parted as a response to the courageous steps of a freed slave named Nachshon. Standing on the edge of the sea in the midst of fear and doubt it was Nachshon who did the miraculous. He stepped in, one foot in front of the other, deciding to have faith. First the water was up to his ankles, then his knees, then his chest until he was almost swallowed whole when he stepped once more and then another miracle. The waters parted.

I mention this because I feel like Nachshon these days. Egyptians behind me in hot pursuit and an impassable sea in front of me. Of course there aren't real Egyptians behind me or a sea in front, but I read the news of the day and it feels that way. Whether it's neighbors being deported, children being abused and neglected, or world leaders behaving like children sometimes it all just feels too big for me, just like those Egyptians and seas. What will it take?

It takes faith. Courageous Faith. It takes living into our baptismal vows and boldly following Jesus. In the United Church of Christ we have baptismal vows and then we reaffirm those vows typically during Confirmation. These are vows and this is what they say:

We teach to lead to profess Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

We promise to be Christ's disciples, to follow in the way of our Savior, to resist oppression and evil, to show love and justice, and to witness to the work and the word of Jesus Christ.

We promise to grow in the Christian faith, to be the church of Jesus Christ by celebrating Christ's presence, by furthering Christ's mission in all the world.

How do we keep these vows when it is so difficult at times? We keep these vows by having faith, courageous faith, in God. In some of these vows we promise with the help of God, some we do the best we are able, and others we need grace to fulfill them. To follow in the way of Jesus takes the help of God, even he had that help.

This Lenten season we are asking you to have some courageous faith. We will be having an Adult study using Rev. Emily C. Heath's new book, <u>Courageous Faith, How to Rise and Resist</u> in a Time of Fear, we will be asking people to give faith witness testimonies during worship, and we will be running a "Journey to Easter" Passport program to encourage you to participate.

Next, they treated the walls and floor and built a 4x4 foot framed section with a top shelf for scout stuff next to the stairs, which



should allow easier storage. Next, they put a second framed wall halfway between the scout section and the furnace room which comes out just 4ft from the back wall and should make organizing games and signage much easier. They also found that the sheet rock on the outside of furnace room was wet, so they replaced the bottom 4 inches with azek board. Finally, Scouts transferred all the materials back into place.
