Pastoral Care Team Update

Many of the members and friends of MCC serve each another in quiet yet important ways; providing meals if a loved one has been hospitalized, sending cards when someone is ill, or offering rides when asked. We are a caring community.

Pastoral care is the faithful ministry of a religious community to the needs of people in face-to-face relationships. A pastoral care giver

builds an intentional, long-term relationship with someone who is ill or hospitalized, or who lives in a nursing home and can't get to worship or church activities. They listen and offer prayer and presence to a person or family going through a difficult time.

By vocation, training, and call, ordained clergy are often a church's main resource for pastoral caregiving. In many congregations, trained lay people become vital partners who extend the reach of that care within a church body. A Pastoral Care Team works with the clergy to assure that spiritual needs are met for those enduring long-term periods of illness.

To be an effective pastoral care giver one must learn some sensitive topics, including but not limited to: deep listening, confidentiality, identifying emergency situations, skill-building, life cycles, bereavement / grief / death and dying, hospital and nursing home visits, when to make referrals to clergy, record keeping, maintaining healthy boundaries and limit-setting.

The model we will follow is a team approach, like Stephens Ministries. Each Pastoral Care Giver will be trained and given one person or family to serve at a time. They will commit to visiting once a month with their person or family. In addition, they gather with other members of the pastoral care team for continuing education and regular check-in's. For the Pastoral Care Giver, learning more can be a time of enrichment and spiritual deepening.

I put out an invitation to our members and friends to join a newly-forming Pastoral Care team a few Steeples back, and some of you have expressed an interest. This September we will meet and begin training. It's not too late to join us, so please do speak with me this summer if you are interested. In peace, Pastor Jenn


