## The Wolf We Feed

You've probably heard the story about the Native American grandfather talking to his young granddaughter. She tells him, "*it's like I have two wolves inside me, one that is mean and angry and wants to eat everyone I meet, and another that's friendly and kind and gentle.*" Then she asks, "*which one of them will rule my personality, which one controls me?*" After a moment the grandfather wisely answers, "*the one you feed.*"

I don't mean to add to it by pointing it out, but sometimes it seems like negativity is a pond too many of us are swimming in. Some of us are even prone to be

proactively negative. We won't wait to be bruised, hurt or offended, we're even going to be ready to make a first strike if necessary. That'll show them!

Some have said that our culture's current negativity has more to do with the economy than anything else. Even though there are some signs of recovery, higher prices for gas and food along with uncertainty about economic markets and employment prospects can lead a lot of us to feeling uncertain. The result can lead to greater suspicion, declining civility and even less recognition of the positive things happening all around us.

Yes, negativity can be a challenge for those of us who claim to take our lead from the life and teachings of Jesus. Writing to the Galatian church, the Apostle Paul suggests that the fruit in the lives of those who are living in Christ's Spirit would be: "*love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things… If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, competing against one another, envying one another* (5:22-26)."

Paul seems to be warning the church about not letting the negative spirit of their age infiltrate and diminish their precious spirit and faith. Then and now, when we learn to trust the "yes" of faith, life opens up for us. The possibility of God's Spirit working in and through us makes us bear such impossibly strange fruits as the one's named above... kindness, gentleness, patience and generosity, love and peace and joy. As individuals and as a church community, finding ourselves on this path of renewal and rebirth gives us an opportunity to rejoice! With the scent of strawberry wafting through the halls, our church year moves from Spring to Summer. As we make that transition, let's not lose sight of the new life breaking forth around us and (if we let it!) within us. Remember to give thanks for all that we have been given in each other and this amazing community.

At the Monroe Congregational Church, we seek to feed that which is positive, that which nurtures our spiritual growth and mission in the world. Here we strive to feed the wolf that points in the direction of faith, hope and love. This is the journey we are on, and it's always easier, better, more fun, when we're on the road together.
