March 15, 2017 "On Pilgrimage: Psalms of Ascents" Psalms 120-134



The Season of Lent invites us to think of going on a journey. Author, Eugene H. Peterson reminds us as we travel to Jerusalem together, we are ascending since "Jerusalem was the highest city geographically in Palestine, and so all who traveled there spent much of their time ascending" (Peterson, 14). Peterson identifies the Psalms of Ascents, Psalms 120-134, in relationship to the journey to Jerusalem. "These fifteen Psalms were likely sung, possibly in sequence, by Hebrew pilgrims as they went up to Jerusalem to the great worship festivals" (14).

The pilgrimages took place "three times a year" and this included "the Feast of the Passover in the spring; ... the Feast of Pentecost in early summer; ... [and] the Feast of Tabernacles in the autumn" (14-15). Imagine a family coming to Jerusalem for one of these festivals, walking all day with their belongings, setting up for the night, and gazing at the mountains in the distance as the sun would set. I have wondered whether Psalm 121 was created with that inspiration? Though majestic, even breathtaking, the mountains did not hold the source of help for the Hebrew believer. Psalm 121 proclaims, "My help comes from the LORD,..." (121:2)

I turn my eyes to the mountains;

from where will my help come?

My help comes from the LORD,

maker of heaven and earth.

He will not let your foot give way;

your guardian will not slumber;

See, the guardian of Israel

neither slumbers nor sleeps! (Psalm 121:1-4 TANAKH)

Peterson reminds readers that,

In going to God Christians travel the same ground that everyone else walks on, ...

The difference is that each step we walk, each breath we breathe, we know we are preserved by God, we know we are accompanied by God, ... the Lord will preserve us from evil, he will keep our life. (40-41)

This does not mean we will be absolved from disappointment, or suffering, or even injustice. We are all aware of circumstances in this church community and among our families and friends, where loved ones are experiencing serious health and other challenges. At times like these we may feel powerless to help those we love. We may perceive God as having abandoned us. At just such a time, it is a comfort to remember that our Guardian, the Holy Spirit, "neither slumbers nor sleeps" and is "at [our] right hand" (Psalm 121:4-5). We are never alone. Never!

Mission is the Flower of Discipleship



Greetings MCC! It has dawned on me that month after month I have been putting a lot of information out and asking y'all to journey with me and you don't really know anything about me. I firmly believe that our sojourn together rests firmly on relationships so I want to tell you a bit about myself.

Besides being your Director of Faith Formation I am also a Member in Discernment at MCC and have an appointment with the Fairfield East Association in April. I am in discernment to become a Commissioned or Ordained Minister – hence discernment. I have a clear call from God to be doing what I do and the understanding of my call is directly related to discipleship and mission. I believe that discipleship isn't about being perfect, it's about following. By definition, a disciple is "a follower, one who accepts and assists in spreading the principles of another". A Christian disciple is a person who accepts and assists in the spreading of the good news of Jesus Christ. In Christian discipleship, we grow in Jesus Christ and are equipped by the Holy Spirit to overcome the pressures and hardships of life and become more and more like Christ. We all follow God through the example of Jesus Christ and we also in turn support and follow each other.

I believe that that mission is the flower of discipleship. By definition, a flower is "the seed-bearing part of a plant", so if Christ is the root of the disciple and the disciple is the plant, mission is the flower. Through mission work I am able to spread the example of Jesus Christ through my actions and the work of my hands and heart. For me mission is

not just about serving in Boston, South Korea, West Virginia, or on the Cheyenne River Reservation in La Plant, South Dakota, it is also about serving the people at church through actively sharing my knowledge, experiences, and witness as well as modeling the Christian life to the best of my ability. It's about inviting others to participate on the journey together.

I have lead numerous trips out to the Cheyenne River Reservation over the years and am scheduled to lead one with you from June 24th – July 1st. The way I lead these trips starts months before the trip happens by fundraising to pay for the trip so it is not a burden on folks who would like to attend. I also understand that asking folks to pay the Simply Smiles Fee and flight is a lot to ask – hence the fundraising and I have never had a participant pay more than \$200 toward their trip! I have some good fundraising ideas, but so far am the only person from MCC signed up. I am hoping more of you might be interested in going now that you know that cost shouldn't be a factor. Subject: Emergency Preparedness Training -- Free!!!!

Want to help?? Not sure where you can help in our community?? For a good introduction to the emergency services in our community you might consider a twenty-hour training program for our local Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)!!

The Department of Emergency Management for the Town of Monroe is announcing another training program for persons interested in being part of a local CERT. Training sessions will be held on two Friday evenings and two Saturdays in April. Most of the training sessions will be held at the Monroe Senior Center at 235 Cutlers Farm Road.

This class is for you! Become trained to help your family, friends, neighbors and the community as you actively assist Monroe's Emergency Services during emergencies such as snowstorms, floods or natural and man-made incidents. Monroe Emergency Management Director (EMD) David York said that "In the several years since CERT volunteers have been active, they have assisted at summer concerts in Wolfe Park, assisted at other events in town, also helped Newtown CERT with an activity there, and most importantly helped for many hours with sheltering townspeople at the Senior Center during our several serious storms and power outages." CERT members have provided assistance to our first responders since they have been trained and are able to help Monroe Police, Fire, Volunteer Emergency Medical Services (VEMS) along with shelter personnel, as well as residents and neighbors when a disaster strikes."

These training sessions will be conducted by four local members of the Monroe CERT, all of whom have been certified as CERT Instructors by the Connecticut Division of Emergency Management and Homeland Security. Other local instructors from our Town Police, Fire and Emergency Medical Service will assist in the training. Persons interested in being certified as CERT members need to be trained for a minimum of 20 hours. There is no cost for this training.

CERT volunteers are trained in a variety of emergency skills such as disaster psychology, first aid, CPR and AED, fire safety, traffic control, hazardous materials awareness, emergency shelters, light search and rescue, disaster scenarios and terrorism. The class is limited to 25 people so interested persons should register as soon as possible. The only requirement is that participants must be 18 years or older.

The class schedule begins with an Orientation on Thursday, April 6 at 7:00 pm at the Monroe Senior Center. Training sessions will be held on Friday evenings from 7:00 pm – 10:00 pm and Saturdays, from 8:00 am – 4:00 pm on April 21 and 22 and also April 28 and 29. The Graduation for the course will be on Thursday, May 25 at 7:00 pm at the Monroe Senior Center.
