A Love that Crosses the Divides

Throughout his ministry of preaching and healing, Jesus invited people into the joy of the kin-dom by inviting them to the table. All were welcome – even the ones whom the religious authorities of the day might turn away. Jesus lived and related to people who were undergoing a process of dying away to an old reality yet on the cusp of being born into a new life of grace.

We recognize that this transformative process is rarely an easy one.

I found myself experiencing something of this struggle while on sabbatical in Jerusalem. Challenged by the suffering and hope arising from those on the margins of life, the reality of war and rumors of war, the cycle of violence and mistrust between Israelis and Palestinians has brought enormous suffering. The effects of this suffering will require generations to heal (if ever). And my time there left me with a big hairy question: How do people who are so entrenched in a history of suffering find the grace and strength to even begin to talk about peace, let alone actively foster it?

But guess what? It's not just this conflict in the Middle East that seems so intractable. I am sure that you can list many others. I wonder, in our little neck of the Connecticut woods, are we capable of co-creating the reign of God on earth as it is in heaven? Do we focus too heavily on the little surface stuff; which a wise friend calls "re-arranging the furniture" of our faith? Do we open ourselves to the way of transformation which calls us to face the forces of death and destruction, both small and systemic, from within us and around us?

Jesus actualized Gods' reign on earth by preaching a message of God's love towards everyone. Jesus' love crossed boundaries and reached people in all the varied aspects of their human conditions. He treated women with respect, acknowledging their rights within a society of unequal standards. He repeatedly expressed his love for children, even making one a model of how we might be present in God's kin-dom.

Then on Good Friday, stripped of all human dignity, exhausted by prolonged torture, helpless before his executioners, deserted by his friends (and seemingly by God, as well), Jesus could have been reduced to a helpless victim. His great suffering, however, did not deprive him of the spiritual strength to publicly express loving concern for others. Nor did it turn him blindly inward, as we so often are tempted to do. With tremendous strength of faith, Jesus prayed for his executioners that they might be forgiven. This is the inspiration we choose to carry in our efforts to change the world that leads to transformation.
