# May We BE the Love

We all have to answer crucial questions in life. When we're young, our parents might ask us, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" and we can say "A fireman" or "A princess" without any hesitation. Years later, that shifts to "what are your plans after high school?" As we get older, the questions get more difficult and our answers become more mature and nuanced. The questions help to build our sense of identity, which is the essence of who we are and who we are becoming.

When Jesus asked his followers "But who do you say I am?", he was speaking to them near the northern city of Caesarea Philippi, a place where many different religions of the Roman world were celebrated. The disciples offered various answers, "[S]ome say



John the Baptist, some say Elijah, and others say you are one of the other prophets" (Mark 8:27). Not satisfied with any of these answers, Jesus turned to his closest followers and asked them a second time, "But who do you say I am?" (8:29).

How we answer the question today has the potential to change us. If we acknowledge Jesus to be an inspired teacher, then maybe we will pay closer attention to what he says so that we might actually live his vision. If we see Jesus as the Messiah, then we recognize him as the one who ushers in the peaceable kingdom. How does who you think Jesus was reflect in who you believe yourself to be? What difference does it make in how you live each day? Jesus called and empowered his disciples to serve and to love, even those (especially those) in the crowd who were considered the most difficult to love. Sounds pretty revolutionary to me.

In this season of divisive political rhetoric, may our words, actions and priorities live into our individual identities as children of God, but may they also reflect who we might come to believe Christ to actually be: Love Incarnate.

# Lay Pastoral Visitation Ministry at MCC

The Lay Pastoral Visitation Ministry is a team of folks at MCC who provide spiritual care, attention and support to individuals in our church, especially seniors and those with special needs. Volunteers train and serve under the supervision of an ordained clergyperson. Pastor Jenn and Rev. Dr. Sheldon

Smith will begin training a group of lay visitors soon.

Generally, if you are a 'people person' and have good listening skills you can do pastoral ministry. The gifts of patience, faithfulness and the ability to hold confidences are also crucial. A sense of 'call' to this ministry is also important. You may have experience as a caregiver that is pushing you towards this ministry, or you are just grateful for what you have and are able to serve. Either way, it may be the stirring of a call!

There are four parts to the training:

- A thorough understanding of the training manual
- Attendance at the three training events following worship on October 9, November 6 and December 4, 2016.
- A trial visit with an ordained clergyperson to an individual in need of care.
- Participation in a commissioning during the December 11th Sunday morning service.

Typically, the time commitment involves the following:

- A once-per-month support group meeting with other lay visitation ministers. These
  meetings involve hearing and discussing verbatims (narratives of visits), training in
  specific skills, and practice in problem-solving.
- At least one monthly visit to the lay minister's assigned person. Typically, this person is a senior and is a shut-in living in his/her home or an elder care facility. It might also be a younger person with special needs. The standard visit lasts about an hour.

Do I HAVE to attend the monthly support group? Yes! The give and take with other pastoral visitors is vital. Ongoing training is refreshing and helps you be more effective. Obviously, there will be times when your schedule will not permit attendance. That's okay, but each pastoral visitor should make the support group a real priority.

Will my interests and skills be matched to an individual to be visited? Yes! Great care will be taken to make sure your gifts and graces match the person you will visit. You will be consulted before a person is assigned to you. If the match doesn't work, we can make changes.

# Pastor Jenn's Sabbatical - February, March & April, 2017

The word "sabbatical" has its roots in the Biblical concept of Sabbath. Sabbath keeping is setting aside time that God consecrates and makes holy. Sabbatical Leave is a time for our pastor to shift gears in order to return and minister among us refreshed and renewed in body, mind and spirit. UCC guidelines recommend a sabbatical every five years and MCC leaders have been committed to providing this refreshment for her and for the congregation. Sabbatical is meant to be a time of rejuvenation for everyone, so that we may hear a new voice in the pulpit and so that laypeople find new opportunities to grow in faith and leadership.

Pastor Jenn is due to take her sabbatical in 2017. It is hard to believe that it has been 5 years since she took her last sabbatical, and this will be the second Pastor Jenn has taken in the 10 years she has served our church. When she returns, as she did after her first sabbatical, she will share with us what she did and learned while she was away. Currently, a team of deacons is actively working with our regional minister, Rev. Michael Ciba, and various church boards, to find a full time sabbatical support pastor to cover and serve while Pastor Jenn is away. Stay tuned for updates.

# What will she be doing during her sabbatical?

On February 1<sup>st</sup>, Pastor Jenn will travel to Israel/Palestine and begin
a three month term as an Ecumenical Accompanier with EAPPI (a
joint project of Church World Service, Evangelical Lutheran Church in
America, Global Ministries of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)

and United Church of Christ, Presbyterian Church (USA), and the United Methodist Church). She is doing so at the invitation of the World Council of Churches, and had to pass a rigorous application, health screen and interview process to be accepted to this program.

As an Ecumenical Accompanier (EA for short), she will serve with a small international team in a designated area of the West Bank or East Jerusalem (exact location to be determined). More than 20 countries send EAs to operate in one of 7 placements across the West Bank and East Jerusalem where they live and work in teams alongside local people for a three month term. These international teams provide presence to vulnerable individuals and communities by monitoring and reporting human rights abuses at checkpoints and non-violent demonstrations. Although there is some personal risk involved, Pastor Jenn will be trained in Washington D.C. prior to her assignment by CWS/EAPPI staff in best practices in safety and conflict resolution. In

its 14 years of existence, over 600 EA's have safely completed their assignment without major injury. She will also be expected to complete a lengthy reading list on the history and culture of the region and current issues, which she will share with the congregation.

How can this possibly be restful for our pastor? Sometimes, rest can be found in doing something completely outside one's normal daily routine. As a pastor who lives 200 feet from the church she serves, she acknowledges that it would be very difficult to focus on sabbatical in the shadow of our Steeple. Although she will be engaged physically in a challenging part of the world, Pastor Jenn will be on duty no more than 40 hours a week, allowing much more time for rest and travel than a typical ministry week of 60-75 hours.

Since 2012, our pastor has been looking for a way to return to Israel/Palestine and become more actively engaged in peacemaking. She has been selected for a unique service and learning opportunity, and we hope that you join us in celebrating her news. We will be planning a range of special activities once she returns to us so that she can share her experiences and learn about what the church has been up to during her time away.

What does her family think? Ask them. They will tell you that they are proud of her and support her fully. They will remain in their family home (the parsonage) and be as engaged with the congregation as is normal for them. They will remain in contact with her via regular e-mail and facetime dates. Although her communications on social media will be monitored for the safety of the program and its participants, Pastor Jenn will be submitting approved stories of personal encounters on a blog, which she will share with the congregation.

What will change while Pastor Jenn is gone? All of our ministries will continue while Pastor Jenn is away on sabbatical, and perhaps new ones will be formed. Church business will be handled by the leadership of the congregation, in cooperation with our regular staff and a sabbatical supply pastor. As soon as more details on the pastor are available, these will be communicated to the church.

In order to continue with our common life, we urge you to continue attending worship on Sunday mornings, participating in learning and serving opportunities, and engaging in conversation on social media. Please also make sure you're on the church mailing list to stay informed! We hope you will join the congregation at the service on January 29 to wish Pastor Jenn well and bless her on her journey.

# "People Helping People" All-Church Day of Service

One thing I would like to tell you about myself is that I am very passionate about the Church being "One Body". What I mean by that is that I believe the more we do together, across the generations, the more vibrant and alive we become. The more we learn from each other and the more we are in relationship and covenant with each other. On Sunday, October 30<sup>th</sup> we will be having a special service day together.



On the People Helping People Service Day, worship will be abbreviated to 45 minutes, so that we can assemble and work together on the following service projects:

- Making Christmas Cards for the children living at Casa Hogar: The people of Oaxaca (pronounced Wa-Ha-Ka) inspired the creation of Simply Smiles when its founder, Bryan Nurnberger, first volunteered at the Casa Hogar Children's Home in 2003. Making Christmas cards for the children living there is one way MCC can keep our connection with them and bring some smiles to their faces!
- Decorating Pieces of Ben's Bells: The mission of Ben's Bells is to inspire, educate, and motivate each other to realize the impact of intentional kindness and to empower individuals to act according to that awareness, thereby strengthening ourselves, our relationships and our communities. Ben's Bells are beautiful, handmade ceramic wind chimes. By the time one Ben's Bell is complete, at least 10 people have been involved in its creation. Ben's Bells are hung randomly throughout the community, in public spaces, for people to find and take home as a reminder to practice intentional kindness.
- Making and Decorating Birdhouses for Habitat for Humanity: At the Habitat ReStore facility, gently used furniture and surplus building supplies are sold to benefit Habitat's projects throughout Bridgeport. We'll make Birdhouses and give them to Habitat to sell at the ReStore shop.
- Winterizing the Giving Garden: We celebrate all the sustainable, organic produce that was grown this summer, but it is now time to prepare the beds for winter. Come ready to get your hands dirty and help us turn the soil to prepare for next year's growing season.
