Rededication of Rexford House: Sunday, September 30

Sometimes, as I enter the building and pass between the portraits of the Reverend Elisha and Mrs. Rexford I wonder what they might think of the building that was dedicated in his name 50 years ago. Just imagine their reaction to seeing Wilton Hall filled with people enjoying shortcake. Would they want to have a seat in the circle with PF on a Sunday night and talk about faith and other things that are on our teen's minds? My office, which currently holds my library of about 600 churchie-type books, might easily overwhelm a man whose personal library was only a dozen (and yet, the most extensive in town at that time!). As the 50th Anniversary of the original dedication of the building draws near this September, we'd like to give thanks for our current blessing, and re-dedicate the building for the future. Please mark your calendars for a **Re-Dedication of Rexford House** following worship services on September 30th in Wilton Hall. It's a party, and All are welcome!

- Since it's a long standing church tradition to cook for each other, we'll share a **pot-luck luncheon**. Indeed, the first churches learned that "breaking bread together" gave them as much a sense of identity as did the teaching, the praying, and the sharing with one another. Being together at table is essential to church as any prayer, hymn, or sermon.
- Gary Thompson (our church's Historian) has been gathering documents and photos of the construction for a
 display table so we can learn more about how it was built (make sure you take a moment and read his
 article later in this Steeple), and Arlene Redmond has been making a timeline so we better understand what
 was going on in the world around us.
- We'll also put together a time capsule, to help the church 50 years from now know more about who we are.
 If you are a member of a board, committee or group and you want to put something that represents your ministry into the capsule, please bring it with you to the luncheon.

Those who had the dream and motivation to bring Rexford House to fruition 50 years ago were addressing a community need for programming space. It was a time of growth, and the congregation needed to stretch and have room for Sunday school classes, offices and other gatherings. Elisha's Corner

...... And So We Celebrate

If you ask any of the few remaining members of the 1965 - 1968 congregation as to why Rexford House was built, you would be told that they had to; no more room to put a growing Sunday school



enrollment and attendance. In the Spring of 1967, the Executive Building Committee for the Rexford House distributed their project brochure, ... and we shall build. It clearly stated that need; "Every nook and cranny is being used twice each Sunday. There is no place left to expand ... no way to meet the new enrollment needs ...no way to keep up with the growth of the community without additional facilities." In the brochure, the new minister, Rev. Robert W. Keeling, wrote, "To maintain the ministry of this church in this community at

this time, this job must get done. If we are to be prepared for the tasks which God will give us in the future, preparations must be made now. The need is so insistent that no other alternative can be contemplated. In my few weeks among you, I have been greatly impressed by the eagerness of the people here to see a task and get it done." And get it done they did, ... but not without a few modifications and setbacks to the plan along the way.

As early as September 1966, the 600 square foot addition to the parsonage bit the dust and was relegated to "future parsonage addition" on the October 1966 and June 1967 site plan map. Focus was keenly set on the space for the church children. There was an \$800 parsonage renovation in late 1967 (\$6,000 in today's market) in anticipation of the arrival of Rev. Keeling, his wife Connie, and their young son in April 1968. In that same month, the roof caved in; literally and over the (Dineson) parlor. This was not what you would call a very warm welcome for the new pastor. In a May 2nd letter to the Executive Building Committee, architect Harry Moeckel wrote, "On Wednesday evening, April 24th, at approximately 9:00p.m., during a heavy wind and rain storm, the roof construction failed and collapsed." This setback in the building program is probably the most remembered and talked about today; small wonder. The letter goes on, "To say that it was indeed an unusual stormy night is borne out by the fact that the official weather bureau for the Bridgeport area [Sikorsky Airport] reported between two and three inches of rain with steady

winds of 29 miles an hour and reported gusts as high as 60 miles per hour. The entire responsibility for the (collapse was) with the General Contractor (Byron Hodges and he)... assumed complete responsibility ..." The cause for the collapse was an accumulation of roofing felt and pea gravel weighing over five tons that had been stored on the roof a few days before the storm. This was four times the designed load. Consequently, the section of the roof over the parlor sagged, filled up with water, and "the already ruptured truces failed". Within a day or two the debris was cleared away, and a design and consulting engineer, Joseph Carlson, Jr. of Shelton, conducted a load test of the rest of the roof trusses and found them to be structurally sound. The Contractor and the architect decided, however, to reinforce all the trusses in the center bay. The fix was in place and construction continued to its completion in September.

On Sunday, September 8th the congregation convened at a special meeting to adopt the name of the new fellowship building. It was George Zaleha who made the motion to name the new building "Rexford House", as suggested by the Executive Building Committee. Bud Morvec, Committee Chairman, explained at the meeting that it was more than a "hall". It had all the attributes of a "house"; kitchen, parlor, separate rooms, office, and lots of closets for storage (never enough). The parlor was named in posthumous honor of Hans Dineson, an active deacon for many years and major church benefactor. Two weeks later the celebration began. On Sunday, September 22nd, Rev. Robert Keeling was installed as the new Pastor. A choir program, including ensembles from Yale University School of Music, was performed, and an "open house" for the community was held that Wednesday, September 25th hosted by the Sr. PF. And on Friday the Women's Fellowship hosted a "fellowship" dinner. That Saturday, the 26th, the Couples Club sponsored a "Family Barbeque". Dedication Sunday was September 29, 1968, following the worship service.

And so we, too, celebrate its 50th year; to re-dedicate and reaffirm the vision of the "dream build"... for our future.
