Following worship on July 21 a dozen or so of our congregation members gathered in Dineson Parlor for a kick-off meeting to plan and organize a Victorian Christmas Fair for December 1st from 1-5 pm. Everyone's input was appreciated, and we are cautiously optimistic that this new fundraiser will indeed take place this year. Initial activities include a Victorian Advent Worship service, renting space to (at least) eight local crafters in Wilton Hall, offering a horse or tractor drawn hayride around the Green and a Victorian model train exhibit in Dineson Parlor. We also hope to offer period crafts and games for children's hands-on participation. Roaming carolers *Just Voices* will perform. PF'rs will have an opportunity to sell Christmas wreaths and possibly more, the Mustard Seed Shoppe may be open for business, and historical tours will be offered in the Meetinghouse.



The CHNA is used to understand the current health of our community as well as to identify priorities for future program planning and funding.
