**December 1, 2020**



Luminarias first appeared around the 16th century. They were used to guide people to midnight mass on the last night of Las Posadas (a Spanish word meaning lodging or inn). Las Posadas is a nine-day celebration which began in Spain, although it's now a holiday tradition celebrated primarily in Mexico and the southwest part of the US. We don't see luminaria as often in the northeast because we spend less time outdoors (*perhaps not in 2020 – we are outside all the time*).

Early on, when used in Christmas celebrations, the Roman Catholic Church believed the lights would guide the spirit of the Christ child to people's homes. They have also been linked traditionally to a vigil bonfire, such as one that would light the night, in order to fend off the growing darkness of this time of year.

Just about everybody loves making a luminary, especially during the Christmas season, because they are pretty and decorative to look at. The original way luminaria were made is similar to how they're made today: put sand (or even kitty litter) in the bottom of a paper bag and insert a candle into the sand, which holds a lit candle in place. Punch out a design in the bag to make it even prettier!

Remember the holidays are all about creating memories. While it is fun to carry on the holiday traditions you grew up with, it's also nice to add a new one to your family's repertoire every once in a while. In the year 2020, as so much has shifted and changed, let's light up our neighborhoods with festive luminaria.

My prayer is that – together – we can think of many ways to make this season special, even in the midst of challenging times. This will not only be a balm for our hearts, but can also help us build a stronger, more connected community. 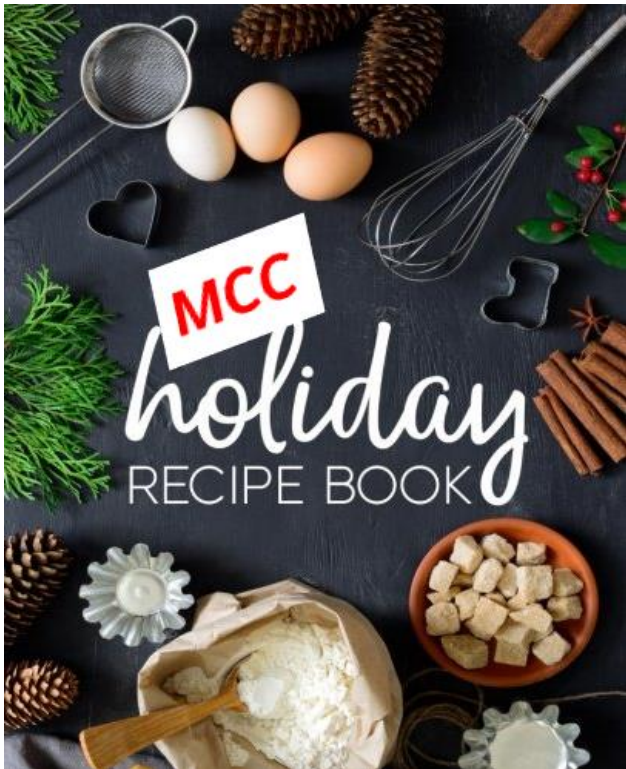

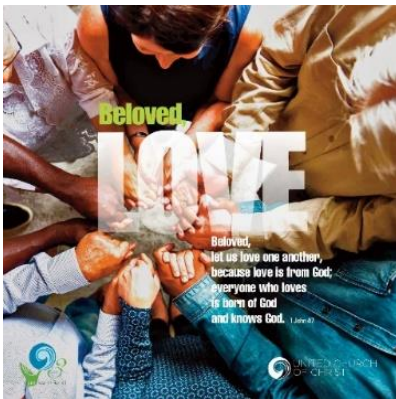


If you'd like to provide socks and scarves, please bring them to the church office by Monday, Dec. 14. Thanks so much for helping our neighbors.
