Thanks for all your help at the MCC 52nd Annual Strawberry Festival!!!!



The 52nd Annual Strawberry Festival was a huge success. With great weather, lots of volunteers, the return of the kids' games, expansion of the Country Store, more than 1,300 jars of jam and quart containers of strawberries to name a few, this year's festival was more successful than last year's.

A report on the net income will follow in a few weeks after all the expense invoices are received and paid. We have a long list of changes and ideas to discuss for next year! Thank you all for making Strawberry Festival a wonderful experience. Here are some preliminary numbers, so you have an idea of how we did.

Area Gross Income

Crafter Booths: \$19,642

Country Store: \$29,130

Shortcakes: \$22,223 (Think about the teams making biscuits, picking and sorting berries, hulling berries, making the juice, assembling the shortcakes, taking orders, running orders down, and running the pickup line!)

Face Painting/Games/Bounce House Painting: \$4,373

120 Loaves of Strawberry Bread: \$840

240 Strawberry Pies: \$4,300

Smoothies: \$7,389

Sr. PF Food Booth: \$12,855

Here are some other incredible statistics:

- 111 Crafter booths sold (record number!)
- 3,200 shortcakes sold
- 120 strawberry breads (\$7 each)
- 240 pies (\$18 each Sold out by 2:30 pm Sunday)

- Of the 1,300 jars of jam we made this year, we sold out of 3 flavors by 12:10 on Saturday and another 8 flavors by 5pm Sunday, including the last jar of Strawberry Jam! *Amazing*!
- About 650 children enjoyed face painting, games and the bounce house
- 119 volunteers signed in on Saturday and on Sunday, with many more doing setup and breakdown
- The Mustard Seed was busy too they made \$2,100 over the weekend
- By Sunday's close, we had run out of dipped berries because we sold so much!

We've calculated our gross total to be a record setting **\$93,000**!

None of this would happen without our dedicated volunteers who woke up early on Friday, Saturday and Sunday to pick all those berries at Jones, got steps in from taking orders for shortcake, collecting them and delivering them to their customers, to those who made pies, smoothies, chocolate-dipped berries, biscuits, sorted berries and so much more.

We are truly a community that comes together when it's needed to provide the support and camaraderie required to get the job done. Capital Campaign Update - MCC Meeting House Roof

As you may have noticed, the **Meeting House Roof has been replaced**, so we should be leak-free for the next 50 years! With an original estimated cost of \$31,476, the roof repair project cost over \$33,876 due to the replacement of damaged plywood found under the old roof. While we are waiting to hear back from the insurance company about whether we'll get any coverage for storm damage to the roof, the Capital Campaign contributions currently stand at just under \$21,000 - so we are well short of covering the cost of the roof repairs. A big thanks to everyone who has contributed to the capital campaign, contributors are honored on our *Raise the Roof* poster in Wilton Hall, - your donations are much appreciated.
