Vaccines & Visiting

Hi folks! I've been watching the news closely, trying to understand where we are headed in regards to the pandemic and our church life together. The good news is that the vaccine pipeline seems to be opening up, despite the difficult winter weather. I've been celebrating with those of you who have received this life-protecting gift, and giving thanks for those in our community and beyond who are working to bring health to us all. Our state is trending in the

top four for vaccinations per capita, and our transmission rate is on the decline. And yet, the tragedy is that so many are grieving the loss of someone they love.

We must continue to protect one another by being responsible about masks, social distancing, and staying home when we're feeling unwell. By the time this Steeple is published, I will have received my second dose of the Moderna vaccine. I'm able to do so because our local health department determined that clergy are eligible because we administer last rites. My hope is that being vaccinated means I will soon be able to visit some folks in the hospital, or in rehab, and shift some office hours from my home to church office.

I found this prayer the other day, that helps me be more mindful of what I am doing as I put on my mask, and I'd like to share it with you – along with my thanks and appreciation of your care for others in wearing yours:

Creator, as I prepare to go into the world, help me to see the sacrament in the wearing of this cloth, let it be "an outward sign of an inward grace", a tangible and visible way of living love for my neighbors, as I love myself.

Christ, since my lips will be covered, uncover my heart, that people would see my smile in the crinkles around my eyes. Since my voice may be muffled, help me to speak clearly, not only with my words, but with my actions.

Holy Spirit, As the elastic touches my ears, remind me to listen carefully - and full of care - to all those I meet. May this simple piece of cloth be shield and banner, and each breath that it holds, be filled with your love.

In your Name and in that love, I pray. May it be so. May it be so.

A note from your (new) Moderator

As a lifelong Episcopalian prior to 2007, I knew little about the Congregational church. So, I have been reading the constitution of MCC trying to figure out what my new job is. Have you ever seen my (formerly Dave Walker's) job description? Well, here it is:

Section 5. Moderator

The Moderator, who shall serve as President of the corporation, shall have been a member of the church for at least two (2) years and shall have served actively within the church structure. He or she shall be elected by the church for a term of two (2) years and shall be eligible for reelection for one (1) additional term, after which he or she shall not be eligible for election to the office until one (1) year has elapsed since the end of his or her second term. The Moderator shall:

- A. Preside at all congregational and Church Council meetings. In the event of the Moderator's absence a Pastor or the Clerk shall call the meeting to order, and the Moderator Pro Tempore shall be elected for the meeting;
- B. Seek to insure [sic] that the government of the church functions within the structure and intent laid down by this Constitution, including providing oversight to resolving constitutional disputes/clarification as required;
- C. Call meetings of any board or committee which finds itself unable to organize or function. He or she may appoint a chairperson or may serve as temporary chairperson, if necessary.

I should mention I am grateful to Dave and Pastor Jenn who have both been very generous with their time and tutelage! So, I am beginning to figure it all out.

I came to MCC when I moved into Connecticut because my (soon-to-be at that time) husband had been a member of MCC starting in 1969. Clearly, he was committed to MCC. As a side note, Vaughan and I got married at MCC in 2008. And, I felt that going to church as a family was more important than my continuing to follow the Tory way (as some might say) – so I did not even try to negotiate a "mixed marriage" – half Tory, New England Congregationalist. I know some people make decisions that are different from the one I made, and I respect that. This is a very personal choice.

Well, I am glad I made that choice.

You will see in the BRIEF description of qualifications for this job that the Moderator "shall have been a member of the church for at least two (2) years and shall have served actively within the church structure." Again, I joined in 2007. Check. "Served actively in the church structure" – is the Renovated Ladies' Bathroom part of the church structure? I should think so. Check. Although I do not think that is what the constitution was getting at. I have been MCC Historian, Deacon, Usher, Mustard Seed volunteer, part of the MusicFest team and probably a few other things...e.g., sous chef making sandwiches in concert with husband on Outreach.

I just wanted to say: hello; delighted to be here; and most importantly, if you want to chat about anything.... If you think there is something the Moderator should hear, know, bring up at Council or sit quietly on.... Please get in touch. Elisha's Corner By Gary Thompson, Church Historian

From the Historian's Notebook

This month was to be the 50th anniversary of the Mustard Seed Shoppe. The published MCC historical timeline indicated that it was opened in 1971. However, since it is of paramount importance to historians and genealogists to maintain accuracy of date and name, a meticulous search for the exact month and day it was opened was begun in unrest. As a result, it turns out that the actual opening day of the Shoppe was March 1, 1974 and not 1971. Surprise! Sorry, no 50th anniversary this month; we must wait until March 1, 2024. So keep the date open, as an anniversary article will be forthcoming then.



The search through our archived proved to be an auditable exercise in search and find. There was virtually no help in the very sparse file marked, "Mustard Seed Shoppe". The key that opened the search was found in the historian notebook of Paul Jones. An article he wrote for the Steeple in 2005 contained the 1974 opening date. It referenced the Women's Fellowship. Among the many, many documents in those files, "the Mustard Seed Shoppe" was not mentioned until 1975, and with a call for more clothing donations (the shop actually started out as a consignment shop). Sound familiar? Not even among the many newspaper clippings of Jean Loveland's articles, was there confirmation of the shop during between 1971 and 1975. Frustration! Fortunately, confirmation was found in a very faint copy of the Shoppe's annual report published for the Annual Meeting held "..... on Sunday, January 19, 1975, at 7 o'clock P.M.". The Shoppe's treasurer at the time, Sherri Wilhelm, began her report by stating that, "The Mustard Seed Thrift Shoppe opened March 1, 1974, with Mary Lou Brigham as chairman. Its purpose is to create additional funds for the church which it has done in the amount of \$1,400 as of December, 1974." Now we

must wait until the March 2024 Steeple for the rest of this interesting story, which is yet to be documented. The published MCC historical timeline has been corrected.

Between now and then the file marked "Mustard Seed Shoppe" must be filled with sufficient and accurate detail to do its 50th anniversary true justice. With that in mind it is requested that anyone, particularly senior women of the congregation, with any personal files, documents, notes, articles, pictures, or even comments and anecdotes, please drop copies of them off or mail them to the church office at Rexford House, Attn: Historian, or E-mail to mailglt@yahoo.com subject: Historian. So much time and dedication by those in the congregation who have created and maintained this seriously important mission effort for the good of our community and elsewhere around the world where a need exists must be honored by preserving and sharing this story of a "little mustard seed" of faith. It personifies who we have been and who we continue to be as a congregation.
