Many of my clergy colleagues are brainstorming about how to mark Advent and Christmas this year. While each congregation is unique in when it comes to buildings, budgets and membership composition, we have been sharing best practices around how best to keep our individual local congregation as safe and vital as possible.

When it comes to our church members, we expect that many will remain closer to home. We anticipate that large family, corporate and community parties will be on

a much smaller scale or perhaps virtual. The things we were able to do safely in worship together will be adapted for the health regulations of this time, which may be hard for those of us who cherish the traditions we have held dear for many years.

Of course, this is nothing new for church leaders – it is a dance we had to begin to learn for Lent and Easter. Over these past 9 months we have had to figure out how to conduct funerals, confirmations, baptisms, weddings and other types of spiritual care either virtually or in person with many precautions.

Traditions that have the potential to harm each other or our neighbors need to be adjusted, and your MCC leadership is planning for an upcoming holiday season that will be, well, different. So let's just focus on the simple message of hope, peace, joy and love that Christ brings, and being together in the safest possible ways. Here's a preview of what to expect:

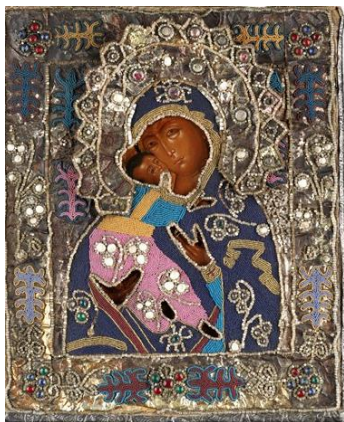
- Current **precautions** will remain in place when it comes to capacity and social distancing.
- We are adding a **4 pm Outdoor Vespers service** around the fire pit on Pierce Lawn (weather permitting) every Sunday night in Advent (beginning Nov 29) and on Christmas Eve. This may be a safer choice for those of you avoiding indoor crowded spaces. Dress warmly.

- Our **7 pm and 11 pm services will be the same format.** This year, if you are accustomed to attending all the services, we ask that you pick one (to leave room for your neighbors) We will also have a 5 pm Quiet service, which is more contemplative.
- A **Christmas Eve pre-recorded service** will be posted on YouTube and Facebook, incorporating the elements of the typical 11 pm service, with special readings and music. For some of you, this year may be a perfect chance to cozy up at home and welcome the Christ child.

If you would like to assist, we are looking for musicians willing to play in worship on Sunday morning and/or later in the day at the campfire vespers. We are gathering recordings from singers and musicians to be used in the pre-recorded service, as well as scripture readers. Please, speak with Will or I if you are able to help out.

Christmas is not cancelled. Christians across the world will still mark the coming of God to Earth in a human body, in ways that honor the human bodies on Earth today. We will remember that God so loved the world that God stepped into the messiness of our lives together. We will still give thanks that God did not come as part of the ruling elite, but into an ordinary family like yours and mine. We will marvel at the place where Jesus first laid his head. We will still rejoice that in the dark, ordinary, difficult places of human experience, God is born amongst us.

Trustees

Trustees Fall 2020 Update

Your board of Trustees have continued to work on our campus and be the caretakers of our finances, despite the challenges of COVID-19. The planning that went into the 2020 budget approved last January did not take into account the disruptions of worship and other activities we would face as a church community later that spring. Fortunately, our YTD expenses are less due to reduced use of our facilities and utilities and we've been very careful about sticking to our budget. Overall, we are fortunate that budget tracking is strong and with your continued commitment on stewardship, we should close the year just about as we expected.

Presently, we have received 75% of the funds people pledged to give from the 2020 Stewardship drive. This is on track and we need to continue throughout the remainder of the year to finish strong. Many members have shifted their giving to the electronic Vanco system, which has made it easier for the member to give and for the Trustees to track (<http://mcc-ucc.org/donate.html>). We are also aware of some members and friends who are experiencing financial hardship, so if you have issues meeting your pledge, please reach out to our Receiver, John O'Rourke at jorourke224@gmail.com.

The Paycheck Protection Program (PPP business loan) we applied for in the spring was granted and the \$42,700 has supported us well. Due to our small loan size, this will be forgiven and we are completing the final forgiveness paperwork on that. This has made up for the loss of income from Strawberry Festival and has helped us cover our expenses.

Our investments have steadily grown this year, from less than \$600,000 to \$625,000 in our most recent statement. Early this year, we stopped withdrawing funds from our investments, after \$22,000, to continue our push to reduce the reliance on these funds to balance our budget. The plan this year was to only drawdown \$50,000 instead of much more in past years. Another part of our budget plan (to reduce drawdowns), was to have \$25,000 made up by other fund raising activities, renters, donations, etc.

We are grateful that the work on the ladies bathroom began Friday, October 23rd – thanks to the generosity of those who were able to support the project, and the drive of the team who have spearheaded the implementation.

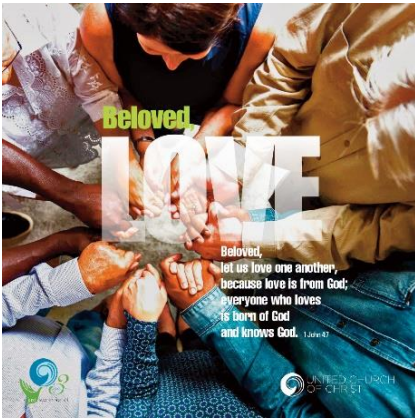
