Dear MCC Members and friends,

Oh my, have I missed you! As I gear up for a return to full time pastoring after a 3-month sabbatical, I thought I would share some thoughts about my time away.

Why did I take a sabbatical? There is no other way to say it - I needed one. I've been deeply involved in ministry at MCC for a little more than fifteen years, and I think it was starting to show. While I've been greatly blessed with my job as your pastor,

the responsibility of being on call 24/7/365 can be taxing (especially given the difficulties of Covid!) The evenings and weekends and extra hours away began to add up and weigh not just on me, but my family as well.

What did I do while I was gone? The goals for this time were straightforward: 1.) go see places of origin 2.) rest and recover 3.) spend time with family

I spent the first week serving as the chaplain at Silver Lake, a volunteer role I'd never done before. In early August, I was able to travel to England with my oldest and see the places our Pilgrim forebears first felt called to leave and find religious freedom. A few weeks later, my

youngest and I were off to Maine to see the house my parents are building. I even returned to my hometown of Madison, camping at Hammonasset State Park (and sadly, presiding at a funeral for my best friend's mom at my home church, North Madison Congregational). These times away were mostly relaxing and refreshing for body and soul, every bit the quality time I had hoped for.

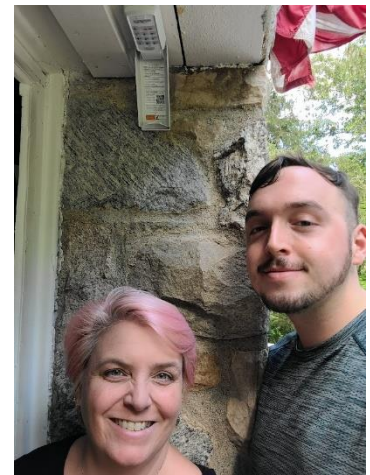
In the midst of these short bursts of travel, I spent most of my time to projects on the house and assisting my middle kid in getting settled into civilian life at home. And I took naps... lots of them! I never really did build that hobby farm that I'd hoped for, and that's OK.

What did I (re)learn?

1. **Being present is not the same as being involved.** Before sabbatical, I was usually home at a reasonable time after each workday, but often found myself often in a state of emotional exhaustion. So, while I might have been in the same room with my family members, I didn't really have much quality, genuine interaction with them. This had become a regular, unhealthy pattern in my life and one that I'm now more aware of and committed to improving.

2. **I need to grow.** The reality is, for nearly every second of the day, I'm usually the de facto decision-maker, problem-solver, or counsel-provider. And while this comes with the territory of leading in the church and doing my mom thing, I believe it's led to an unhealthy level of emotional exhaustion and compassion fatigue. I've come to realize that I have to find more ways to listen, to learn, and even to be led sometimes.

3. **I am blessed.** Okay, this is more something I've re-learned. My love for MCC has only grown during these 3 months. I am thankful to have such a supportive church family; including council leaders, deaconate and dedicated staff who have allowed me to take this renewal time. I'm also grateful to Rev. Peggy Allen for holding down the fort while I was gone. All the reports I've gotten indicate she's done a stellar job as a sabbatical supply pastor. Finally, I have such a wonderful life-partner in Clark (and I need to do a better job of telling him that regularly!)

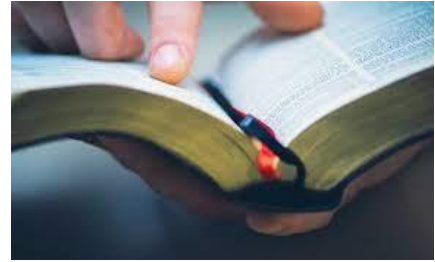

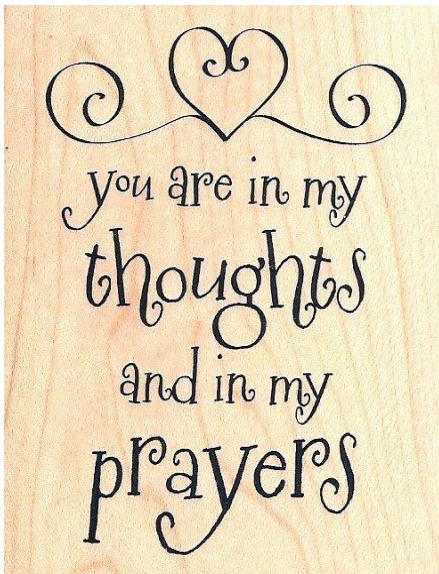

I hope you consider signing up.

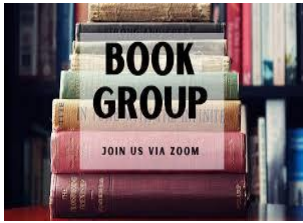

Elisha's Corner

A Green Anniversary



On October 22nd of this year the Monroe Congregational Church and St. Peter's Episcopal Church will have been co-owners of the Monroe Centre Green for 150 years. On that day in 1872 the Treasurer of Park Association of Monroe, William A. Clarke, a member of St. Peter's, deeded "... about three quarters of an acre, be the same more or less, ..." of "the Park" to the churches for \$175 (nearly \$4,000 today). Until that day the existing Green consisted only of less than the half acre that Capt. Joseph Moss and Nehemiah de Forrest jointly conveyed to the inhabitants of the New Stratford Parish of the Ecclesiastical Society in 1780. The Moss deed was for 40 square rods, one quarter (0.25) acre and the de Forrest deed (most recently found and now in our archives) was for 24 square rods, one fifth (0.15) of an acre. Both of these deeds were conveyed on the same day;

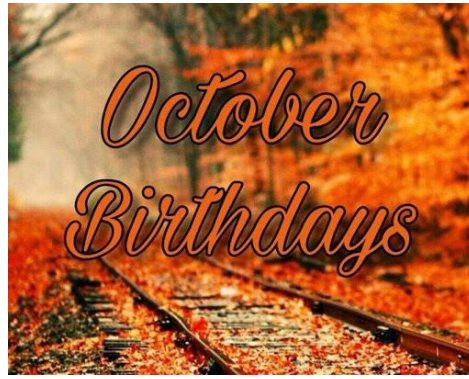
December 5, 1780; but the 0.40 acre Green was not formally established until April 21, 1784, when both deeds were received and recorded at the County Court of Fairfield.

On that same October day in 1872, an additional one-half (0.50) acre parcel was deeded to the Park Association and annexed to the south end of the then existing Green. The Association purchased that parcel for \$100 (over \$2,100 today) from the home property of widow Hepsey Beach, a member of the Congregational Church. In turn, on the same day, it sold the full 0.90 acreage of the Green to the two churches. The transaction must have gone without much fanfare, for no articles exist in either of the two Bridgeport newspapers of the time and there were no other newspapers around Monroe that would have carried the event.

It is unclear whether the Park Association was a public association or was privately operated. There is no evidence as to the membership of the Association, either. It is not recognized in the Historical Society's archives, nor listed in the Town Clerk's archives. It only appears on the deeds conveyed on October 22, 1872. It is quite possible that it was created prior to when the Town of Monroe was established in 1823. One can only speculate that it was made up of members from both churches. It is interesting that the deed to the churches, signed by William A. Clarke, was witnessed by E. A. Clarke, and Homer E. Clarke (Justice of the Peace). The deed to the Association signed by Hepsey Beach was witnessed by William A. Clarke and Hepsey's son, John D. Beach. Not only was Hepsey's land adjacent to William's, but he was also a distant relative to Hepsey's sister, Sally French, who married William's second or third cousin, John Clarke. Today it is the only town Center Green in Connecticut that is privately owned by two churches. From the beginning it was set up "to be used wholly and exclusively as a Public Park"

Our Centre Green has been depicted in the 1836 sketches and prints by John Warner Barber and in 1996 by local artist David Merrill's lithograph mural of Monroe displayed in the Edith Wheeler Memorial Library. Barber's sketch of a near half acre rectangular piece of land (east and west), across the road from our 1769 Meeting House shows an easement, like a foot path, extending diagonally from Old Tannery Road to Fan Hill. They do not depict the topography. However, a Monroe Historical Society file picture of the Green prior to 1872 gives evidence that the Green was rough, uneven, and full of rocks, and with a flagpole. A picture, taken after 1872, shows an iron rail fence around a neater, more inviting Green. Today, the rocks, flagpole and rail fence are long gone. Over the years since its purchase both congregations have been worthy custodians keeping the Centre Green as pristine as possible. Faithfully, too, we have been helped by the Town Park and Recreation Department who mow the grass, provide a fall clean-up, and clean up storm related debris. Most recently, in the spring of 2018, the lawn was reclaimed around the trees, holes and depressions filled, grass seeded, and the lawn fertilized.

In 1977, Town Historian, Edward Coffey, eloquently described our *Centre Green as "the heart of the community ... a memorial to the town's early fathers whose foresight recognized the need for such a gathering place and whose gift provides the bustling modern generation with an island of serenity and reminiscence of a worthy heritage."* It stand worthy of this 150th Anniversary. Two families, one from each church congregation, the French's and the Clarke's, made it all come about.
