Franz Xaver Gruber (1787-1863) was born into a linen weaver's family and studied violin and organ even though his father wanted him to work in the family business. In addition to serving as parish organist for St. Nicholas Church in Obendorf, he taught school in nearby Arnsdorf (1807-1829) and Berndorf (1829-1833). He spent the balance of his career as organist and choir director in Hallein, where he founded the famous Hallein Choral Society.

Joseph Mohr (1792-1848) was born at Salzburg, Austria, on Dec. 11, 1792. After being ordained a priest on Aug. 21, 1815, by the Roman Catholic Bishop of Salzburg. The lyrics to the pretty little carol *Stille Nacht!* heilige *Nacht!* were written for Christmas, 1818, while Mohr was assistant clergyman at St. Nicholas Church in Obendorf. It was set to music by Franz Gruber, who was the schoolmaster at the neighboring village of Arnsdorf and parish organist.
